

TERMS FOR SKI RENTAL:

- 1. Bring valid identification when renting ski and snowboard equipment. Valid ID is mandatory for renting equipment, including for picking up pre-booked and paid equipment.
- 2. To rent equipment at Sunnmørsalpane Skiarena Fjellsætra, the renter/guest must be 18 years or older or be accompanied by a guardian who is at least 18 years old.
- 3. All payments must be made in advance.
- 4. The renter is responsible for checking and approving the equipment before use.
- 5. The renter acknowledges that alpine ski bindings are of the release type, reducing the risk of injury but not guaranteeing safety. Snowboards do not have release bindings.
- 6. Alpine skis can easily be mixed up. Remember what your skis look like and where you place them! It is not permitted to hand over, sublet, or sell rented equipment.
- 7. Equipment must only be used on marked and groomed slopes.
- 8. Damage to the equipment due to misuse must be compensated.
- 9. The rental provider is not responsible for theft of the equipment.
- 10. The renter is responsible for the equipment during the rental period.
- 11. The rental provider is not responsible for personal injuries incurred by the renter, property, or third parties during the rental period.
- 12. No refunds are given for interrupted rentals due to bad weather, lift closures, injuries, or other reasons.
- 13. Equipment must be returned to Sunnmørsalpane Ski Rental at the end of the rental period.

TERMS FOR SKI SCHOOL:

- 1. Payment for ski school must be made before the lesson starts, either online or at the counter.
- 2. Cancellations and changes up to 48 hours before the lesson start will receive a full refund minus a NOK 200 processing fee.
- 3. Cancellations within 48 hours before the lesson require a medical certificate for a refund, minus a NOK 200 processing fee.
- 4. For adults: It is very helpful for ski school instructors to be informed of any special needs the child may have before the lesson begins. This allows us to provide the best experience for the child. Parents should also ensure that children arrive with energy and have eaten beforehand to get the most out of the ski school.



SKI SAFETY: (In collaboration with Norske Alpinanlegg og Fjelldestinasjoner)

It is important to wear a helmet, be considerate of other skiers and snowboarders, and follow skiing safety rules.

Skiing should be safe for everyone, and we all share the responsibility for skiing safely.

Follow these skiing safety guidelines to ensure a safer alpine experience for yourself and others:

1. Responsibility to avoid injury

You must conduct yourself in a way that does not pose a danger to yourself or others. Always maintain control of your ski and snowboard equipment. You are responsible for preventing your equipment from causing harm to people or property.

2. Adjust your speed to conditions

Ski in a controlled manner and adjust your speed and technique according to your skill level, terrain, weather, snow conditions, and traffic on the slopes.

3. Yielding right-of-way

If you approach from behind, you must choose a path that does not put others at risk of collision.

4. Overtaking and downhill skiing

You may pass another skier or snowboarder, provided there is enough space for them to move freely. Straight downhill skiing is prohibited except during organized training.

5. Entering, merging, or turning uphill on a slope

If you enter, merge, or turn uphill on a slope, ensure that this is done without posing a risk to yourself or others. The same applies when resuming skiing after stopping.

6. Stopping on the slopes

Avoid stopping on narrow sections or areas with limited visibility unless absolutely necessary. If you fall in such a place, move away as quickly as possible.

7. Walking on the slopes

If on foot, always use the edges of the slope.

8. Respect signs and markings

Follow all signage, markings, and instructions.

9. Helping in case of accidents

All skiers and snowboarders are required to assist in the event of an accident.

10. Identification

Witnesses and individuals involved in accidents must provide their personal details.
